

I.A.C. Aquatic Ace Creates Mark To Win

Weissmuller Takes Long Race to Keep Title, Samson Places Fourth.

Chicago, April 8.—(A. P.)—A new world's record, four seconds faster than the former mark, was set tonight by Johnny Weissmuller in winning the 500-yard free style race of the national A. A. U. senior championship.

This victory also gained him the A. A. U. all around national championship medal. He finished in 5:28 2-5, leading Harry Giancy of Philadelphia by 20 yards.

Albert Zorrilla of the New York A. C. and Captain Paul Samson of Michigan took third and fourth.

The former record of 5:32 2-5 was held by Arne Borg, who also held the former A. A. U. mark of 5:43 2-5.

Pete des Jardins of Miami Beach, Fla., the outdoor diving champion of the National A. A. U., added the indoor highboard title to his string. He won from a field of 18 with Farid Simaika of the Ambassador club, Los Angeles, second. Simaika won the lowboard championship Wednesday night. Mickey Riley, also of Los Angeles, was third.

been less keener, the chances are Wagner would have made only ordinary time.

Albert Zuber, City College of Detroit, made the state A. A. U. shot put record 44 feet in the second number of the evening. Fred Alderman, Michigan State captain, one of the great college sprinters of the United States, ran the 100 yards in 10 1-5. This event is rare indoors. Alderman tied the 75 yard dash record which is 7-10 seconds, before establishing the new mark for the century.

A fraction of Detroit's Negro population that was in attendance went into rhapsodies of joy when Eddie Tolan of Cass Technical defeated Alderman in the 50 yard dash. Alderman is not a short distance sprinter and was hardly started before Tolan had the race.

Alderman just a few minutes later won from Tolan in the 100 yard dash. Tolan after the 50 yard mark was passed could not draw abreast of the flying Spartan.

From the thrill standpoint, the two-mile run was the banner race on the card. Ted Callahan, former University of Michigan runner, competing unattached, sprinted to victory in the last lap after it appeared that Chauncey White of the Y. M. C. A. would pass him. Potter, Michigan State Normal, also had enough left to render White's challenge void, and passed the Indian on the home straightaway.

Andrew Lewis, another Y. M. C. A. entry, who won the state A. A. U. title at East Lansing last February, pulled up from last man in a field of 15 to fifth place when the first of the last two laps began but the pace of Callahan and Potter was too much and he could not improve his position.
