

COLT ATHLETES TOP QUALIFIERS FOR CITY MEET

**Northwestern Places in Every
Event and Leads all Rivals
With 19 Finalists.**

ONE RECORD ERASED

**Turanchoff, of Cass, Batters
Shot Put Mark by One
Foot and a Half.**

Northwestern advanced a step closer to another high school track championship yesterday afternoon by qualifying 19 event entries in the preliminary of the seventh annual city meet at Codd field.

If there is strength in numbers, the Colts should retain the title they have held since 1925, as Northern and Northeastern, counted upon as the most formidable opponents, failed to match the Northwestern athletes in the trial events.

Northeastern, leaning through the showing of Hearty, national high school champion, qualified 21 event entries. With numbers was the lead taken by Northern, and three others showed promise, and the Old Western qualified 19, while Cass Tech will have five in the finals. Southwestern, Eastern and Southeastern each came through with four, and Roseland and Highland Park trained with two.

Turanchoff Sets Mark.

Of the 14 schools entered, Strathmore, Central University of Detroit high and Hamtramck failed to place an athlete in the final. There was little competition except in the 220-yard dash and 400 yards, where extra heats were necessary to determine the winners.

For Cass Tech went the honor of shattering the only record of the preliminary which approached that the shot of feet 48, inches to better the mark established by Glenn Carlson of Northwestern in 1925, who made it feet 47 1/2.

The best of the other events was a record approached because of the pairings that separated the outstanding athletes in various heats. But it all in a general fashion on the existing marks in the final this afternoon.

Cass Does Well.

Able from getting a new distance in the shot, Turanchoff also topped the field in the javelin with a throw of 143 ft. 1 1/2 inches, a time that is 14 feet below the record but will suffice to gain him top position. With the support that the Mechanics minor is certain to get from Eddie Tolan and Smith in the track, Cass is set to be a strong contender for the defending champions.

Tolan follows by 3/16 of a second to equal his own mark for the century dash to test the field when he was timed in 18 2/3 seconds, but met with a setback when Hinesell, of Northern, established the best time for the 220 in doing the distance in 21 1/4 seconds. Again Hinesell in the century and 220 and in face of Hinesell's performance of the century dash should be one of the best events in the final.

Another Cass star made his presence felt when Smith rated the best half mile in the city with exception of Hearty of Southeastern, easily finished past the gold in 2:07 1/4.

Hearty Stands Out.

Northeastern's hope of dethroning Northwestern was given added impetus by the ability of Hearty to establish the best marks in three events. He topped the gold in the high hurdle with a mark of 18 4/5 seconds, and duplicated in the low hurdle in 12 2/3 seconds, both of which barely missed equalling the city records. Following this showing he also led the broad jumpers with a leap of 29 ft. 1 1/2 inches. Lewis, team mate of Hearty, failed to come through as expected, though he never was promised to win his heat of the quarter mile though
