BENTON HARBOR PUTS TWO MEN ON, ST. JOE, SIX

Black and Moulton Davis Qualify in Two Events, Davis Wins Hundred

LANSING, Mich., May 28.—Michigan's high school athletes meet today to decide, in competition, crowning of the state's individual and team track and field champions.

St. Joseph Technical High school of Detroit team champions for the past year, qualified few men in the preliminaries yesterday. Detroit, Northwestern, qualifying 12; Detroit Eastern, with its stars entrenched in six places, and Kalamazoo with its strength in the distance events, all were considered higher than the last year's champions.

representative of the last year's Class B champions, while Otsego, class C leaders, failed to qualify. A new class D also is awaiting a new leader with the end of tomorrow's trials.

St. Joseph was given an outside chance to place high with six men running. Dowagiac with seven, and Potoskey with eight, had better balance and a chance to take Class B competition.

Benton Harbor placed only Black Goldstein in a fast field dominant by the schools from Detroit. It will undoubtedly place high in high jump, possibly taking the title, and may be heard from in the pole vault event.

Moulton Davis, of St. Joseph took the hundred yard dash, and will probably repeat in the finals, with a possible 440 winner.
