

**FALCONS GIVE N'WEST'N HARD RUN FOR TITLE**

Northeastern Has 27 Points to 29 for Red and Gray Athletes.

**LEWIS FEATURES MEET**

Makes 440 Mark in 50.25 After Equalling Record Day Before.

East Lansing, Mich., May 28.—After an oval of one hour, Northwestern High School of Detroit, suffered in the attempt to break the field competition here this afternoon by winning the annual state meet, during the course of which four records were shattered and another equalled.

The meet was the hardest fought in the history of state competition as the Cubs just managed to nose out their most feared rival, Northeastern, in a series of two victories.

The Bruins finished 21 points by virtue of five first places, and a third in the century dash.

Though it was forced to trail the club, Northeastern always was a threat because of the combined efforts of Eugene Henley and John Lewis and one other athlete. One out of the return by dispatching the heavy weight of last year's and Lewis, the leading runner in the country, made by Northwestern in 1925.

The other marks to fall were in 440 yards, where Walter Hoffmeyer of Ann Arbor, broke the 31.1 mark made by Peter Fony of Detroit in 1925. In the one and a half mile dash Lewis won the title and set a new record of 8:57.4. In the 100-yard dash, he made 14.5 seconds, bettering the mark of 14.7 seconds made by Lewis in 1925. In the 200-yard dash, he made 34.5 seconds, bettering the mark of 35.5 seconds made by Lewis in 1925.

Lewis, ahead his previous career with the fastest 440 yard dash in the country in 50.25 seconds, set a new record of 50.25 seconds in the 440 yard dash, bettering the mark of 51.5 seconds made by Lewis in 1925.

Lewis, a member of the team which won the state title last year from Campbell had left him in the race at the 100 yard mark.

While only two points separated Northwestern and Northeastern at the finish, the race for other places was not so close. One team, or rather two, were tied for first place and pulled up in third place, with 25 points, while Lewis had 21 points.

The Bruins, with 27 points, led the state with 13 and the other schools were scattered, only 11 other schools having more than 10 points.

Northwestern, 27; Northeastern, 29; Detroit, 21; Ann Arbor, 19; Detroit, 17; East Lansing, 15; Ann Arbor, 14; and Holland, 11.

With 29 points Northwestern was far enough in the lead to finish the meet. Hoffmeyer, the victor of the race, this did not show any more than from the first with an extra yard between the two schools and for a time the Bruins had a narrow lead.
