

Colts Win Track Meet

Northwestern High track team won a triangular meet at Codd Field yesterday afternoon, scoring 91 points to 36 for Eastern and 5 for Central. Northern outscored Redford in a dual meet, 73 to 58, while Western

was high-point scorer in a triangular meet, Western 74, Southwestern 41, Hamtramck 8.

Northwestern took every place but the pole vault, which went to Eastern, Vogt and Lewis being tied for first place. Leo Cavanaugh of Northwestern took first place in the mile and 880-yard run, while Dant annexed first honors in the

220-yard dash. Dant's time was 23 3/5 seconds. Lafayette of Eastern was second.

Erskine of Northwestern won first place in the hurdles, with Rein second. Swan took the broad jump with a leap of 20 feet 1 inch. Oxley, also of Northwestern, was second.

Western established itself as one of the strongest teams of the city

by its victory yesterday. Bator of Southwestern was the leading star in the field, winning the javelin and hammer throws. Falls of Western copped the discus throw.

Northern and Redford divided the first about evenly, but Northern had the better second and third place men.
