Heads Individual Scorer With 12 Points, First In Javelin Ann Jump Events

**Kalamazoo Central Takes Meet, Grand Rapids South
Second; St. Joseph Second
in Class B**

Ralph Black and Moulton Davis ran away with the honors for the win cities at the Kalamazoo Normal school interscholastic track meet Saturday afternoon. Black took a first in the high jump, first in the javelin throw and third in the discus in class A. He was high point individual for the meet, and consequently was awarded the cup emblematic of that feat. Black alone made 12 of the 17 points that put Benton Harbor in third place. The remaining five counters were won by Lake and Lewis, who took a third in the high hurdles, fourth in the discus and fourth in the 880 event respectively.

Beside the handsome 18 inch loving cup for high individual performance, Black won a trophy for both high jump and javelin events. Davis took first in the 220-yard event easily, and lost first place in the century event by a single yard. It was Davis' maiden appearance on the Kalamazoo track, and his first important interscholastic appearance. He gives every indication of becoming a pointer for the Maize and Blue.

Sims, Zitta Win
Sims took the 440-yard event, and Zitta the javelin, to put St. Joseph in a tie for second place in class B with Three Rivers. Both totaled 5.7 points. Briney and Zitta tied for second and fourth in the pole vault, while Klemm took second with the javelin. The relay team took third place. Klemm is a recent find in the javelin for Howe, and is a promising man for next week's meet.

Berrien Teams Left Out
Berrien's other entries, in class C and D, failed to place many men in the competition.

Both Benton Harbor and St. Joseph were more or less dark horses for the meet. Especially Howe's men, who came through to place in fast field. More than 600 athletes competed in the running Saturday, in ideal day of golden sunshine greeted the competitors, and officials and athletes cooperated in a successful way to make the events run smoothly and swiftly.

Saturday's meet marks Benton Harbor as the probable winner in the Little Thirteen meet to be held next Saturday on Filstrap field.

Holy Cross Star Covers 100 In 9-3

WORCESTER, Mass., May 9.—Authorities of Holy Cross college were hoping today that Jimmy Quinn, Holy Cross student, would be recognized officially as having equalled the best time ever made for 100 yards by a human. In winning the 100-yard dash at Kingston, R. I., Saturday in a meet between Holy Cross and Rhode Island State college he was timed in nine and three-fifths seconds. This time has been recognized as the world record by the National A. A. U. officials and as having been made by four other sprinters.
