

11 MARKS FALL AT YPSI MEET

Only Two Track Records With-stand Attack of High School Athletes.

YPSILANTI, Mich., June 11.—Records are made to be broken and that is what contestants in the Suburban High School League track meet here yesterday proceeded to do.

Of the 13 records made in the first annual games a year ago, only two stand today. The other 11 were shattered by ambitious athletes Friday.

The meet was an unusual one in many respects. Not alone were 11 meet marks broken but not a single titleholder of last year, several of whom were back again, was able to retain his championship. Plymouth High, last year's team winner, also was forced to give way to Dearborn, the latter win scoring 59 points to 50 for the 1926 champions.

ONLY TWO MARKS STAND.

New records were established by Robert Stanton of Dearborn in the javelin throw and shot put; by Edwin Jackson of Dearborn in the broad jump; by Ted Hickey of Plymouth in the 100-yard dash; Carl Thiel of Dearborn in the discus, John Calder of Dearborn in the 440, Howard Middleton of Plymouth in the mile, Fred Shaw of Dearborn in the low hurdles, Archie Crumm of Plymouth in the pole vault, Robert McCardle of Northville in the high jump and the Plymouth relay team in the half-mile relay.

The only old records to stand were the half-mile and the 220-yard dash.

Besides winning the javelin throw and the shot put, in both of which he set records, Stanton also won the 120-yard high hurdles. The latter event, however, did not count in the team scoring. It will be placed on the championship program in 1928.

HERO OF MEET.

Wendell Doudt, of Plymouth, was the hero of the meet though he did not win a first place. Entering the meet with an injured leg as a result of a foot ball accident last year the Plymouth youth was able to take seconds in the 440, the high jump and the broad jump. His sprinting also gave Plymouth first in the relay. Doudt was several yards behind the Dearborn anchor man when he took up the baton on the last lap, but he was able to overtake his rival in the stretch and just beat him out at the tape, his shoulder touching the tape a shade ahead of the Dearborn runner.

Six schools took part in the games and five placed in the scoring, Wayne, runner-up last year to Plymouth, failing to count. The team standing: Dearborn 59; Plymouth 50; Roosevelt Ypsilanti 16; Farmington 7½; Northville 7½.
