### JERRY RELKIN SCORES FIRST AT ANN ARBOR

Takes High Jump In Michigan  
School Track  
Carnival

Jerry Relkin, Fort Huron high jumper, soared into the air six feet at Ann Arbor Saturday night to capture the high jump event at the University of Michigan interscholastic invitational track meet.

Relkin's great performance marks him as the first Port Huron track or field athlete who has scored points in a contest of national prominence and the only man who has ever taken first place in any state meet.

The Port Huron boy's record was better than that scored the same night in the Michigan-Harvard meet of the University of Illinois medley relay carnival at Urbana. At the Michigan-Harvard meet, Waldo of Michigan won with a jump of five feet and seven-eighths inches. At Urbana, Brent of Drake was tied with Carr, Illinois, Gitter, Marquette and Sheppard, Texas, for first with five feet, 10 1/2 inches.

As a result of his sensational performance Relkin may go to the eighth annual Northwestern university intercollegiate track meet at Evanston next Friday and Saturday. Athletic Director Melvin Myers was to confer today with Superintendent of Schools H. A. Tule and Principal Packard on the advisability of sending Relkin to meet where his record, if repeated, will insure him at least a place and probably top rank in his local event.
