

NORTHEASTERN AGAIN LANDS TRACK HONORS

Beatty Leads Falcons to Victory and Equals Mark in Hurdles—Highland Park Easily Gains Swimming Laurels.

EVANSTON, March 24.—High school athletes representing the metropolitan district of Detroit monopolized the sixteenth annual national interscholastic track and swimming meets at Northwestern university here this afternoon when Northeastern repeated its victory of a year ago to land the track diadem, and a newcomer, Highland Park, made a show of the field in the pool.

In winning the track title last year, Northeastern relied upon two colored youths, Eugene Beatty and John Lewis. This afternoon Beatty returned with another dusky partner, Love Snowden, and between them accounted for 18 points, to gain a slight edge over Detroit Northwestern with 14½, and Cass Tech, of Detroit, that counted 12 points.

It was Beatty, a one-man track team, who made victory possible as he won both hurdle events, equaling his own meet record of .081-10 seconds in the highs, placed third in the half mile and fourth in the 50-yard dash to become the high point scorer of the meet.

Collapses, Then Sets Mark.

An incident in connection with Beatty's record performance stood out as the high light of the meet. Entered in the half mile, he gave the leaders a race until the last few yards and collapsed as he crossed the finish line in 2.04. Undaunted by this misfortune he returned to the track in less than five minutes and achieved his mark in the hurdles. Not contented with that, he ambled down to the pit and barely missed placing in the shot. His was the most remarkable showing ever made here in the prep meet.

However, Snowden's part in the triumph was welcomed as he accounted for five points in winning the 50-yard dash and that was the success needed to land his team on top.

While Northeastern reached the pinnacle, the meet virtually was a Detroit affair, as Northwestern pressed the Falcons throughout the afternoon by winning the mile and 440. Thompson took the longer event in 4.41 4-5 with a team mate, Hurd, in

Cass Tech Close Behind.

Good as the Colts were, though Cass Tech continued on their heels and between the three schools none of the others had a chance. The five Detroit schools represented accounted for 61 of a possible 114 points.
