

## FALCONS FINISH IN SECOND PLACE

**Three Records Created as Northwestern Wins Its  
Fifth Indoor High School Track  
Championship.**

**Beatty Leads Individuals With 13 Points—High  
Jump Standard Shattered After Standing  
Five Years.**

THREE records fell as Northwestern high school, seven times city high school indoor track champion, won its fifth successive title at Central last night with 43 points, while Northeastern became runner-up with 30 points.

The mark for the high jump, one of the oldest on the books, was the first to go. Huntington, of Eastern, jumped 5 feet 9 1/2 inches in 1923 and it stood the assault of the city's best until last night, when Ware of Hamtramck and Sampson of Cass went over the bar at 5 feet 11 inches. Dennis and Ward, both of Northwestern, tied for third place, dropping out of competition early in the event.

Turaboli of Cass Tech bettered the best distance for the shotput by 4 feet 6 inches when he tossed the lead 50 feet 7 inches. Thompson of Northwestern was the other to establish a record, turning the half mile in 2:06.2-5-2.3-5 better than the previous time.

**Beatty Leads Scorers.**

Beatty, of Northeastern, was the individual star of the meet, totaling 13 points, with Doubs, of Northwestern, second with 11. The Falcon scored first in both low and high hurdles and rounded out his total with second in the shot. Dennis was runner-up to Doubs in the hurdle event and tied for third in the high jump.

From the outset, competition was chiefly between Northwestern and Northeastern. After the 100-yard dash, mile run, hurdles, 440, high jump, shot and 220 were finished, they were tied with 25 points.

In the next event, the half mile, Thompson, of Northwestern, clinched the meet by his record-breaking performance, with Gay taking fourth to make six points.

**Turaboli Shows Form.**

In the preliminaries last Wednesday Turaboli put the shot 31 feet, but he was denied a record at that time when the shot he used was found to be one pound lighter than the regulations require.

Not a large man, he showed the finest form and spirit of any man ever developed in high school circles, and every ounce of his some 140 pounds was utilized in pushing the lead away from his shoulder to have it land far beyond that of any other competitor.

Smith, of Cass, winner of the half mile last year, was present at the meet, but was not in the field which Thompson led by five yards to the finish line in setting a new record. Thompson, a colored boy of slight build and comparatively short of stature, set the pace from the start and with long strides pounded out the grueling distance.

**Thompson Achieves Goal.**

In the first dual meet of the season, Thompson, 1927 cross-country champion, tried out for the mile and soon was finishing at Carlson's heels when the latter relinquished the distance in near record time.

In an effort to give better balance to the team, he was tried in the half mile and although not accustomed to put forth his best effort in the shorter distance, made a runner of it. At the finish last night he was tired but not exhausted, the stamina he gained from his cross country training standing him in good stead.

Several records were approached by fractions of a second in the dash events and every finish with the exception of Thompson's, the man in second place was but a second yard in the rear with the rest of the field close behind.

**HAHN SETS RECORD.**

New York, March 3.—(A. P.)—Lord Hahn, rugged Lincoln A. A. star, ran the greatest half-mile in a track history tonight, shattering a world indoor record, as well as surpassing the outdoor mark by winning a special race in 1:10.4 in 21.2 seconds in competition with the I. C. A. A. championship games held here.
