

# YALE CAPTURES CLASS C TITLE

## Thumb Athletes Run Away With Track Honors

East Lansing, May 26.—Yale High school won the Class C. state track and field meet here today with 28 points. Paw Paw was second with 17 1-2 points. The half mile relay, the final event on the program, clinched the meet for the Thumb school when Slosser, Stalet, Salerno and Williams, romped home far ahead of the second place team.

Other Thumb district teams won their share of points in the meet with Vassar, Marlette, and Lapeer scoring points in Class C. also.

Two Port Huron men broke into the scoring in Class A when Wonderlic, dash man passed Snowden, Detroit Northeastern, in the final yards of the 220 yard dash to take third place and two points. Relkin, Port Huron, tied for fourth in the high jump and gained a half point. The event was won by Sampson, Cass Tech. He set a new record with six feet, three-eighths inches.

### Caro Scores

Two Caro athletes scored in Class B. Putnam tied for first in the mile run with Hoyt, Dowagiac while Rakovitch scored a fourth in the shotput.

Yale monopolized honors in Class C. Salerno, Yale, evened matters with Sanford, Marlette, for the double defeat he took several weeks ago at the hands of the Marlette flyer, by beating him to the tape in the 220-yard dash by inches. Slosser, Yale, took the 220-yard low hurdles in the fast time of :28.2 seconds. Williams, Yale, took a second in the 440-yard run, the event being won by Atkins of Vassar. Roberts, Lapeer, scored in two field events, will landing fourth places in both the shotput and discus throw.

Two more Thumb athletes battled it out in the 100-yard dash. Craig, Romeo, beating Sanford, Marlette, by a foot. The time was 19.6.

Salerno then went on to set a new record in the broad jump with a leap of 21 feet, 31 inches, breaking the mark of Ailyn, Farmington, 1924, by nine inches.

Andreae, Yale, scored a second in the javelin throw, the winning mark being 154 feet. Belx, Lapeer, tied for second in the high jump, the winner setting a new class C mark of five feet, seven three-eighths inches.

Almost athletes scored in Class D. Jersey, with a second, and Hart, third, were next to Dildine, Lake Shore, in the broad jump. The Lake Shore star set a new record of 19 feet, 4 1/8 inches.
