

# CASS TECH TIES RAPIDS SOUTH FOR 2D PLACE

Four Athletes Give Falcons  
32 Points and First State  
Prep Championship

Team Now Rules Supreme  
in City, State and Mid-  
Western Track Circles

EAST LANSING, May 26.—  
Detroit Northeastern won the  
state track and field title here  
today by collecting 32 points.  
The Falcons had a big ad-  
vantage over the rest of the  
field. Five firsts, two seconds  
and a fourth gave the new  
champions their impressive  
total.

Detroit Cass Tech and Grand  
Rapids South tied for second place  
honors. Each team gathered 17  
points. Detroit Northwestern, de-  
fending champion, was one point  
behind these two. Northwestern  
failed to win a single first place.

Northeastern won the national  
outdoor title at Chicago last year  
and this year added the indoor  
championship to its list. The out-  
door campaign thus far has  
brought a city, midwestern and  
state championships.

The new title holders entered  
four athletes and all, save Snow-  
den in the 220-yard dash, did what  
was expected of them. Snowden,  
when pressed by Nelson in the 220,  
quit cold, finishing fourth.

Two more records fell in the  
field events. Edwin Turashoff  
made a new mark for posterity to  
aim at by hurling the javelin 165  
feet 1 inch. The old mark made  
in 1924 by Cooley of Kalamazoo  
was 161 feet 8 inches.

Robert Sampson of Cass Tech  
crossed the bar in the high jump  
 $\frac{1}{8}$  of an inch higher than the  
former record held by Dennis of  
Detroit Northwestern. The new  
record is 6 feet  $\frac{3}{8}$  inches.

The first upset of the meet came  
in the 100-yard dash, the second  
event on the programme. In the  
trials yesterday Lester Nelson of  
Grand Rapids South and Love  
Snowden of Detroit Northeastern  
tied for the best time, each cover-  
ing the distance in 10 1-5 seconds.

In the finals today Nelson got a  
step lead in the first five yards and  
then proceeded to show a clean  
pair of heels to Snowden, covering  
the entire distance without chang-  
ing his slight margin. Snowden  
scored an easy victory over the  
Grand Rapids flash in the Mid-
