

GIRLS' SPORTS ARE NEAR END

Southwestern Likely to Be Displaced as Track Champion Thursday.

New Meet Records Expected; Dates for Final Net Play Not Set Yet.

High school girls near the close of their interscholastic athletic activities with the sixth annual city track and field meet at Codd field Thursday afternoon. Southwestern is defending champion.

Full returns on the season's tennis matches have not been made and with the track meet scheduled for this week the city doubles and singles team championships may not be determined for another week.

There is a possibility that one of the matches will be played in conjunction with the track meet and the other the following day, but this won't be decided until the first part of next week.

Close Meet Expected.

Northwestern has won the championship of League I, Highland Park, defending city champion in both doubles and singles, is virtually certain of the title in League II, but has a postponed match with Central to play yet while the best in League III is not known.

Southwestern won the track championship by a margin of only one point over Southeastern last year with Western in third place. The meet promises to be as close again this year.

Central Is Strong.

Because of the irregular schedule for track, little is known of the comparative strength of the respective teams but as Southwestern has little left of the team that won the title, a new champion may be decided.

Central looms as one of the strongest contenders for Southwestern's laurels with Northern and Highland Park rated next. Records in the broad jump and high jump are almost certain to go next Thursday and with a good start several other marks may be eclipsed.
