

TWO RECORDS SET BY COLTS

Hurd and Thompson Break Records as N'western Collects 55 5-6 Points

Heston Scores Brilliant Victory Over Beatty in High Hurdles.

Establishing new records in the half mile and mile, Northwestern High school athletes ran up one of the largest totals ever made by representatives of the Colt institution in the tenth annual indoor city track and field meet held at Central last night, scoring 55 5-6 points to 19 for Northeastern, the runner-up, to annex its ninth title in 10 years.

Wesley Hurd, Colt miler, clipped 9 1-5 seconds off the record in winning the mile in 4 minutes 39 seconds, in what proved to be one of the main features of the evening. The old mark was 4:48 1-5, set by Cavanaugh, of Northwestern, in 1927.

Jaydell Thompson, dusky little Northwestern half miler, cut 12-5 seconds off the mark for the 880-yard run he set in last year's meet in another brilliant race.

Northwestern took five out of 11 first places to run up its overwhelming total. Eugene Beatty, colored ace of Northeastern's team, was high individual scorer with 12 points. He won first in the low hurdles, second in the low stocks and tied with Penick of Northwestern for top position in the 220-yard dash in a brilliant exhibition that

marked his last appearance in a Detroit high school city meet.

Jack Heston, Northwestern football man, defeated the speedy Falcon ace in the high hurdles by scant inches and came as close to winning in the low hurdles. In the latter Beatty broke the cross stick in starting and finished last, but the race was run over and Heston, who had given his best in the other heat, was nosed out.

It was the first defeat for Beatty in the hurdles in the city meet in three years. He won both numbers in both 1927 and 1928. Northeastern's other points came through Dykas' tie for first with Burgess of Northwestern, last year's winner, in the 440, and a second by Ecknovich in the record breaking half mile event.
