school in the finals. With favorable weather conditions today, either one of these two boys is expected to break the record shared by Ross of Northwestern and Beatty of Northeastern. The former ran the distance in 13 2/5 in 1926, while Beatty equaled the time in 1927.

In the field events, a close duel is expected between Northwestern and Eastern, which may possibly include Western. Lewis's 5 feet, 10 inches in the high jump, just an inch under the record made by Dennis of Northwestern in 1927, is favored to beat the entries of Colts. Eastern's second qualifier in this event is Pittrich, another youth who promises to keep Northwestern from taking either of the first two places.

The Colts qualified nine in the field, with Huber in the discus event the strongest entry. Huber tossed the discus 117 feet, ten and one-quarter inches yesterday afternoon with little or no effort. But he will have three Redford boys competing against him.

Eastern, with six boys qualified, will depend a great deal on Pittrich to come through in at least one of the three field events in which he is entered. He performed well in the high jump, broad jump and javelin events to qualify.

Although Western showed weakness on the track, where it only qualified one man, the Cowboys displayed unusual strength in the field by placing five men in the finals. Cass sent three over the top here, with McCracken the outstanding star and one who is almost certain to place first in the javelin. His mark of 147 feet, three inches was the best turned in. U. of D., Highland Park and Northern failed to qualify anyone in the field.
