

**COLTS FAVORED  
IN STATE MEET**

**Heston, Huber, Ward and Relay Team Conceded First Places.**

**Oliver of Cass Is Due for Hard Competition in Short Dash.**

East Lansing, May 21.—Figuring on the basis of performances turned in by athletes competing in the regional track and field meets, Detroit Northwestern high school favorites to win the Class A title, looks good for at least five first places in the state championships to be held here Saturday.

Jack Heston seems to have the field beaten in both the hurdle events for his time is a full second better than any of the other regional meet winners in the high sticks and he is expected to win the lows by a comfortable margin.

The Colt relay team ran two seconds faster than any other quartet in the state while Ward and Dennis, who tied for first place in the Detroit city meet high jump, are three inches ahead of the field.

**Huber's Throw Best.**

George Huber beat the discus throwers by more than 12 feet. These 25 points, which are virtually in the bag, will alone almost clinch the title and the points from the other place winners should put the scarlet and gray far ahead.

Otto Pongrace, of Detroit, Eastern, may shoot at the state record of 4:32.2 in the mile run but he will have to better his time of 4:36 of last Saturday to win. Beyne, of Grand Rapids Ottawa Hills, was the best of the outstate lot last Saturday with a mark of 4:41.3.

**Due For Hard Race.**

Lovegrove, of Flint Central, will give Oliver of Cass Tech a race, although his time of :10.4 is two-tenths of a second slower than that of Oliver's. This same Flint runner looks like the class of the field in the 220-yard dash for he has consistently turned in time of :22.6 and once touched :22.2. No other runner got under 23 seconds last Saturday.

Times turned in for the quarter

mile indicate there will be a real race for the state championship. Keast, of Lansing Central, had the best time in the qualifying round with a mark of :32.2-5.

**Three Seek Event.**

Whichever of Jackson Central made the quarter mile in :52.6, while Leon Dykes of Detroit Northwestern did the distance in one-fifth of a second slower. Three athletes loom as possible winners of the half mile. Braden of Flint Northern led the field with a mark of 2:02. Karl Kahler of Redford won the Detroit city title in 2:03.4 while Travis of Kalamazoo Central turned in 2:07.

There should be some keen competition in the field events. In the shot put there were four athletes who put the 12-pound ball out over 42 feet, while nine touched the 44-foot mark. Joseph Beer of Detroit Eastern was the head man in the trials. He shoved the weight out 43 feet 1 1-2 inches. Just behind him were Snyder of Kalamazoo Central with 43 feet 1 inch; Dill of Saginaw Arthur Hill with 42 feet 4 inches, and Cook of Grand Rapids Union with 42 feet 8 1-2 inches.

**He's Best in Javelin.**

Jack Hernley of Lansing Central should win the javelin throw easily if he is in trim. He looped the spear out 162 feet at Flint last Saturday while Snyder of Kalamazoo and Earl McCracken of Cass Tech belated 147 feet. Four others are very evenly matched in the broad jump. Taylor of Kalamazoo Central was out ahead with a leap of 21 feet 2 1-2 inches, while Thad Dennis of Detroit Northwestern is close behind him with 20 feet 10 1-4 inches. Battle of Port Huron, and Monamerra of Pontiac are in the 19-foot class.

Muskegon seems certain to grab off a first place in the pole vault. It is possible that Wilson, the Muskies star, will go after the record of 11 feet 10 1-8 inches. He was only six inches under this mark at Kalamazoo last week and was not extended. Moore of Northwestern, and Jacobs of Southeastern accomplished 11 feet last week.
