

Colts Have Big Edge in State Track Meet

EAST LANSING, May 25.—Detroit Northwestern was overwhelming favorite to regain the state track title it lost to Northwestern last year in the finals of the annual meet, which was to get under way here this morning. In the preliminaries yesterday the Colts qualified nine men, while the schools that placed second, Cass Tech and Muskegon, had six each.

Four records fell during the day, three in the javelin. Jack Hermy of Lansing Eastern tossed the rod 171 feet 8 inches. The old record of 165 feet 1 inch was made by Edwin Turaschoff of Detroit Cass Tech a year ago. Paul McKinley of Cadillac sent the spear 165 feet

through the air to set a new class B record. Thiel of Dearborn threw the discus 121 feet 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ inches while Beaumont tossed the javelin 155 feet 9 inches.

While conditions were ideal there was little shown that would indicate that track records would fall today. However, several interesting races are promised for this morning. Charles Ecknovich of Detroit Northeastern and Jack Heston of Northwestern are certain to stage a real battle for honors in the hurdles. Thus far they have broken even, Jack holding the edge in the high hurdles while Charley has topped the low barriers faster than his opponent.

Hershey of Western and Leon Dykas will give the fans a thrill in their act in the 440. These two have finished one-two in all important meets this season and will likely compete in the nationals next week.

There are 26 schools competing in the finals today, a new record for the state. No defending champion is an outstanding favorite to retain its title although Dearborn has an excellent chance to again finish on top in Class B. Dearborn qualified seven in the final while Niles has the same number and Cadillac six.

Maxam, who tied for first place in the midwestern meet at Ann Arbor two weeks ago failed to qualify in the pole vault as did most of Detroit leading vaulters. Two other favorites from outside of Detroit failed to get into the finals. Paul Lovegrove of Flint Northern failed to finish in the money in the dashes while Frank Hoff, Lansing Eastern's star high jumper missed on the qualifying height.
