

# TEAMS WRECKED IN QUALIFYING TESTS OF MEET

## Detroit Northwestern Leads Qualifiers—Flint North- ern Places One.

East Lansing, May 25. — (By AP)—With ranks decimated by the fatalities of the state regional meets a week ago and the casualties of the preliminaries here; Friday, the four classes of the Michigan high school track and field forces buckled down today to the task of naming championship teams and of finding the individual to wear the event titles for a year.

After yesterday, none boasted a well balanced team. Northwestern, Detroit, had nine men, with still others in the mile, half-mile and relay in which preliminaries were not contested. The Colts had the largest semblance of a team and had qualified most of their stars.

Individuals from 88 different schools survived the finals, Friday. Twenty-four of these represented Class A schools, 19 were allotted to Class B and 30 to Class C, where 16 individuals represent as many different schools. Class D was not compelled to show its ability on the track, and 15 of its smaller number of schools survived in the field events.

Hernly, a student of the recently organized Lansing Eastern, tossed the javelin 171 feet 8 inches for the best mark of the day. Petoskey, of Saginaw Eastern, was not far behind, getting the benefit of a "break." His spear was descending when it struck the cross-bar of the goal posts and shot into space some 10 feet in advance of its purported resting place. As the javelin rules call only for measurement from balk line to sticking point, Petoskey received the benefit.

Other new marks for the state event were a toss of 163 feet 4 inches by Rajkovich, of Caro, for a new Class B javelin mark; one of 155 feet 9 inches by Beaumont, of Okemos, for a new record in Class D, and a discus throw of 121 feet 1/2 inch by Thiel, Dearborn, for another new B mark.
