

Jack Hernley Wins Championship In Javelin Throw at State Meet

JACK HERNLEY, of Lansing Eastern, captured a state interscholastic championship and a state record as well Saturday at the Michigan State college stadium when he tossed out the javelin 171 feet 8 inches. The former mark was 165 feet 1 inch made by Turashoff of Cass Tech of Detroit in 1928.

Final races were being held in Class A, B, C and D in the state interscholastic track and field championships.

Other local youths placed well, however. Hoff, of Lansing Eastern, was fourth in the high hurdles, Keast, of Central, was fourth in a fast quarter-mile and Balmer, of Central, was tied for fourth in the pole vault.

440-yard dash—Won by Hershey (Detroit Western); second, Dykas (Detroit Northeastern); third, Oldfield (Flint Northern); fourth, Keast, (Lansing Central). Time—:50.7.

Discus throw—Won by Huber (Detroit Northwestern); second, Stout, (Pontiac); third, Helmer, (Muskegon), fourth, Burton, (Grand Rapids Central). Distance—127 feet, (new record). Former mark 126 feet 11 $\frac{3}{4}$ inches made by Wilson, Ann Arbor, in 1925.

220-yard low hurdles—Won by Ecknovich (Detroit Northeastern); second, Eberhard, (Grand Rapids South); third, Van Avery, (Highland Park), fourth, Heston (Detroit Northwestern). Time—:25.

Javelin throw—Won by Hernley (Lansing Eastern); second, Petoskey (Saginaw Eastern); third, McCracken (Detroit Cass Tech); fourth, Snyder (Kalamazoo Central). Distance—171 feet 8 inches. (New record). Former mark, 165 feet 1 inch made by Turashoff, Cass Tech in 1928.

Pole vault—Won by Wilson (Muskegon); tied for second, Goldstein (Benton Harbor) and Moore (Detroit Northwestern); tied for fourth, Fogliatti (Detroit Cass Tech) and Malke (Ann Arbor), Balmer (Lansing Central). Height—11 feet, 10 $\frac{3}{4}$ inches.

220-yard dash—Won by Oliver (Detroit Cass Tech); second, Praczak (Grand Rapids Union); third, Zahner (Ann Arbor); fourth, Zakerzewski (Grand Rapids Union). Time—:22.7.
