LOCALS STRONG IN FIELD EVENTS

George Baird Is High Point Man with 12 Counters, Including a First.

BUSBY WINS HIGH JUMP

Earl Lutz, Baseball Pitcher, Takes Second in 100 and Third in 220 Dash.

Battle Creek high schools strength in the field events was not strong enough to overcome Eastland Central's superiority in the track program and the local champions dropped a dull sheet to the Capital City tracksters by a score of 721 to 100 at Greenbush Hall Saturday afternoon.

Who These Were
The Detroit track squad accomplished three firsts, even records, four thirds and one tie for third out of 12 events. In the first five events to be run off, Battle Creek took second in each one while the Central athletes ran off with firsts and thirds.

George Baird was high point man for the locals with 12 points to his credit including one first, two seconds and one third. He took second in the 120-yard high hurdles and pole vault; first in the 100 and 220 yard dashes; and third in the 120-yard low hurdles.

Overshine Places Tenth
Earl Lutz, veteran pitcher on the Detroit baseball team, placed his name on Saturday afternoon and took a close second in the 100-yard dash and a third in the 220-yard event.

Overshine garnered a second in the mile run and also in the 800-yard dash, while Dave Knight won with a jump of 12 feet 3 inches.

The third first captured by the locals was won in the high jump by Busby, who cleared the bar at 6 feet 5 inches while Left tied with Wins of Lansing for third place in this event.

Pole Vaulter Subbed
Other places won by the local tracksters were a second in the 400-yard dash by Maxwell, and a third in the same event by Wiers. Character captured a third in the half-mile, and the relay team was best on but three occasions were given the honors in this event.

Relay
Relay, centrally, had a broken ankle after the pole vaulting event. He had already won the jump but was unable to hold the bar when he cleared his feet on the crossbar. In fact, he twisted it in such a way that it was necessary for him to be taken to the hospital for treatment.
