

Froebel Wins High School Track Meet at Stagg Field

Froebel High of Gary, Indiana, ran away with the twenty-fifth annual national interscholastic track and field meet held on Stagg field yesterday. The tournament, sponsored by the University of Chicago, drew over 900 athletes representing thirty-three states.

Froebel scored 42½ points to lead Arsenal Technical High of Indianapolis, which finished second with 28 points. Fort Collins, Colo., winner of three first places and a second in the last five meets, took third with 26½ points. Tilden Tech. of Chicago tied for fourth with Fulton, Missouri, and Central High of St. Joseph, Missouri, with 22 points each.

Metcalf Ties Record. Mooseheart won first place in the academy division with 42 points. Lake Forest finished second with 38 and Culver had 32½ points for third place.

Despite a cold driving northeast wind, and occasional rain flurries, the meet was the fastest ever staged. One world's interscholastic record was shattered, four meet records were broken, and three world's interscholastic records were tied.

Ralph Metcalf, Tilden Tech's chunky colored boy, started the record-breaking off when he dashed to the tape in the 100 yard dash in :29 8-10 to tie the world's interscholastic record. A few minutes later he came back to tie also the world prep mark in the 220 yard dash, when he negotiated the furlong in the fast-time of :21 4-10 seconds.

Jack Keller of East High, Columbus, Ohio, staged another field day of his own, by breaking the world's interscholastic record in the 220 yard low hurdles. He skimmed the low barriers in 24 seconds flat to crack the old mark by 2-10 of a second. A few moments before he had soared over the 120 yard high hurdles to tie the world's prep mark of 1:15 2-10 seconds.

Keller and Metcalf Lead. Metcalf and Keller tied for individual point honors in the high school division with 20 markers each, on the basis of 19-8-8-4-2-1 scoring. Bill Lawrence of Mooseheart scored 18 points in the academy division, on the standard 8-4-2-2-1 point ratio, winning the

high jump, taking second in the broad jump and the javelin throw, and fourth in the shot put.

Fuqua of Brazil, Indiana, ran a beautiful race in the 440 yard run, to set a new meet record of :49 4-10 seconds. Central High of Columbus, Ohio, shattered the meet record in the second race of the 880 yard relay, when its team traversed the distance in one minute 32 7-16 seconds, beating the old mark by 2-10 of a second.

Elwyn Dees of Lorraine, Kansas, who set a new world mark of over 58 feet recently in the 12 pound shot, tossed the ball 56 feet 7 inches yesterday. Bud Houser, California giant, held the old mark of 56 feet 3 inches.

Bill Moreau of Fort Collins, Colorado, ended the record-breaking performances when he tossed the discus 136 feet 11 inches to beat the meet record by six inches. Summaries:
