

Jack Hernly Takes Second Place In Javelin Throw at Chicago

Special to The State Journal CHICAGO, June 3—Jack Hernly, Lansing Eastern, Michigan interscholastic record holder in the javelin throw, captured second place in the event at the national interscholastic track and field meet held at Stagg field here Saturday. Hernly's best throw was 171 feet 11 inches, 3 inches more than his toss in the Michigan state meet a week ago which set a new record in high school circles.

The javelin throw at the national meet was captured by Clark, of Barnsdale, Okla., with a heave of 178 feet 4 inches while Vlobig, of San Jacinto High, Houston, Tex., was next to the Lansing Eastern star with a mark of 170 feet 8 inches.

Hernly, with a second place in the javelin, equaled the performance of any of the Michigan athletes entered in the meet. Hershey, of Detroit Western, finished second in his section of the 440-yard race while Ward, of Detroit Northwestern, tied for second in the high jump.

Froebel High, of Gary, Ind., took team honors with 42½ points while Arsenal Tech, of Indianapolis, Ind., was second in the scoring with a total of 28. Fort Collins, Colo., winner of the 1928 meet was third this year, scoring 26½ points. Among the Michigan schools Detroit Northwestern, state champions, made the best showing finishing in ninth place with 17¾ points.
