

TRACK HONORS TO S'WESTERN

Victory in Relay Decides Girls' Field Championship Meet at Very Outset.

Colts, Defending Champions, Lose by One Point as Five Records Fall.

Victory in the relay gave Southwestern girls' track and field team 20 points at the outset and enabled it to nose out Northwestern, defending champions in the annual city meet at Codd field yesterday. Five of the seven records were broken.

Southwestern, which won the title in 1927, had 15 points, Northwestern 14, Rockford and Western 8, Southeastern and Highland Park 6, Copley 5, Central and Eastern 3, Northeastern 4 and Northern 3.

Irene Skabo, anchor runner on Southwestern's relay team, was passed to the utmost by Madeline Cornwell, Northwestern's fourth runner, and fainted as she crossed the finish line in the event which brought her team victory.

Margaret Demchak Wins Jump.

To Mary Abraham, of Central, went the honor of breaking the oldest existing record on the books, that for the baseball throw set by Florence Wolfe, of Eastern in 1905. Miss Abraham bettered the old mark of 202 feet, 11 inches, by 13 feet, 8 1/2 inches, one of the most sensational performances of the meet.

Frances Anderson, of Highland Park, and Katie Thoms, Hamtramck, bettered the mark set by the former in the high jump by one and one-half inches, tying for first at 4 feet 10 1/2 inches.

Margaret Demchak, who accounted for the rest of Southwestern's points broke the mark for the running broad jump by 5 1/2 inches. The old mark of 12 feet, 5 1/2 inches, was made by Ethel Harwood, Western, in 1927.

Recent Breakers Lose in Finals.

Helen Hearsh, of Northern, succeeded in bettering the record for the 75-yard dash in the preliminaries and again in the semifinals by one-fifth of a second, being timed in 6 seconds flat. Her exertions cost her first in the final, however, Ann Gault, of Western, tying her new record to win.

Virtually the same thing occurred in the 50-yard dash, when Mary Horck, of Highland Park, clipped a fifth of a second off the mark in a preliminary which she won in 6 seconds flat. She was beaten by Alben King, of Northwestern, in the final. The latter tied the old record in winning.

Virginia Parry, Northwestern's all-around star, was unable to compete because of illness in the family and probably would have brought her team victory with an entry of 224 completed.
