

ONLY ONE MARK SET IN STATE A. A. U. MEET

Ketz, One of Five to Break Records Last Year, Beats Record for Hammer Throw—Beatty Defeats Cooper, Michigan Hurdler.

WILFRED KETZ, University of Michigan weight man, added to the glory of his athletic deeds by romping away with the individual honors in the State A. A. U. track and field meet staged under the supervision of the department of recreation at Belle Isle yesterday.

Wearing the colors of the Cadillac A. C., Ketz gained the distinction of breaking the only meet record smashed during the assault of 169 of the state's foremost athletes by hurling the 16 pound shot 153 feet, 4 1/2 inches to eclipse by 15 1/2 inches the mark he himself had set last year.

Not content with this performance, the sturdy Wolverine also took first place in the 36-pound weight event in which he defeated Haskins of the police department by half an inch with his throw of 29 feet 2 1/2 inches, and then went on to take first honors in the javelin throw. After giving his team 15 points Ketz called it a day and the 6,000 people who witnessed the meet were willing to concede he had earned a rest.

It was the performance of Ketz which enabled the Cadillac athletes to roll up 117 points and retain the championship won in last year's meet by a big margin. In second place and 96 points behind came the Detroit Police department with 21 points. Third place in team honors went to the Detroit Athletic association which garnered 20 points, and fourth to the Y. M. C. A. which had 13. University of Detroit with 8 points; Western State Normal college, 5; Adrian college, 4, and Eastern high school with 1 point finished in the order named.

Eugene Beatty, former Northeastern high all-around star, took second place to Ketz in the individual scoring. Beatty, who wore the colors of Detroit Athletic association, won first place in the 120 and 440-yard hurdles and third in the broad jump.

Ray Swartz, Western State Normal college miler, who might easily have bettered the mile record in last year's meet had he had more competition, was in the same fix yesterday. He took the lead at the start and was never threatened.

first half of the distance, when Simonson, Cadillac A. C. veteran distance man, attempted to force the race but failed and saw Ross, a team mate, finish second, 75 yards behind Swartz.

Noanachuk Beats Rival.

Eugene Beatty won the 440-yard hurdles with a great sprint on the final lap by 25 yards and followed it up with a sensational victory in the 120-yard high hurdles in which he bested Don Cooper, University of Michigan's star, who represented the Cadillac A. C.

Harvey Noanachuk, City college pole vaulter, renewed rivalries with Harold Oliver, of Ypsi and came out first with a leap of 12 feet. Oliver is from the Cadillac A. C.

Al Silber gave City college an additional five points with first in the running broad jump but finished only second in the high jump, his favorite event, won by Schier, of Western State, with a leap of 5 feet, 9 inches. This was an upset since Silber has done better than six feet a number of times this spring.

Edwin Turashoff, whose city and state prep records for the shot put set while he was at Cass Tech still stand, easily took first in his number, restricting Policeman Haskins to second place.
