

Detroit Preps Win Midwest Track Meet

ANN ARBOR, March 15.—Detroit Northwestern thineclads won the sixth annual University of Michigan interscholastic track and field meet in Yost Field House today by amassing a total of 35 points.

Froebel High of Gary, Ind., waged a bitter duel with the Colts to land in second place with 30 1-5. Lakewood, O., took third and Toledo Scott, fourth place.

Four records fell by the wayside during the course of competition, and a fifth was tied. Dykns of Detroit-Northeastern smashed—the first standard when he ran the 440 in 52 1/2, just 6-10 of a second faster than the old mark set by Moxley of Columbus in 1928.

It was Ward, Colt star, who virtually won the meet for the Northwesterners. His 14 points, collected by copping first in both hurdles and tying for the initial position in the high jump, were far and away the best exhibition of the carnival.

Ward equalled his mark of 07.5 in the 65-yard low hurdles, established jointly with Zimmer of LaGrange, Ill., in the preliminaries last night. Vaulting to unprecedented heights, Wonsowicz of Froebel added eight inches to the old mark, scaling the bar at 12 feet 5 1/4 inches.

Ward continued his record smash-

ing tactics when, in the closing event of the carnival, he tied with Glickert of Toledo Scott at 6 feet 2 1/2 inches in the high jump. The old record was held by Thornton of Harvey, Ills., at 6 feet 1/2 inch, set in 1926.

The last standard to fall was the half mile relay mark of 1:35.2, chalked up last night in the preliminaries by Froebel's sterling quartette of sprinters. Today's record clipped 1-5 of a second off the former time.
