

WARD BETTERS JUMP RECORD

**He Does 6 Feet, One Inch,
While Mates Take Lead in
Quadrangular Meet.**

**Northwestern Athlete Also Ties
Fundis for High Scor-
ing Honors.**

The city high jump record of six feet and one-half inch was beaten by Willis Ward, of Northwestern, by half an inch in a quadrangular meet with Mackenzie, Central and Western at Central field yesterday afternoon.

Due to the length of the track meets a split in the events was created and on one day the track events are contested and on the next day the field events. At the completion of the field events yesterday the Colls were leading their opponents with 33½ points.

Willis Ward did six feet, four inches to create a new city indoor mark during the winter and likely the record will be bettered again as Ward stopped jumping at six feet, one inch. The Negro athlete will have a competitor before he finishes his high school jumping in Arnold Deneau, a tenth grade lad from Mackenzie high school, who did six feet yesterday to gain second place.

Jack Fundis of Northwestern captured two firsts in shot put and discus throw, respectively. Fundis will have to better his discus throw mark by five feet in order to tie the city record. The pole vault was won by Sidney Moore and Noel Maxam, both of Northwestern, at 10 feet. Willis Ward and Jack Fundis were tied for the high honors for the field events with 10 points. Mackenzie high school's 5½ points were accounted for by Arnold Deneau.

Pole vault—Won by Mason (Northwestern) and Maxam (Northwestern) both tied for first, third, Wagner (Western), Smith, Bolog (Western), and Wilson (Central) (tied). Height—20 feet.

High Jump—Won by Ward (Northwestern), second, Deneau (Mackenzie), third, Wagoner (Western), fourth, Miller (Northwestern). Height—6 feet 1 inch (new city record).

Discus throw—Won by Fundis (Northwestern), second, Wolkham (Northwestern), third, Carlson (Central), fourth, Buchanan (Central). Distance—110 feet 5 inches.

Shotput—Won by Pineda (Northwestern), second, Lendke (Western), third, Sabin (Central), fourth, Deneau (Mackenzie), fifth, Brown (Central).

Shotput—Won by Wood (Northwestern), second, Swanger (Central), third, Hart (Northwestern) and Jensen (Mackenzie) (tied). Distance—29 feet 4 1/4 inches.

Final summaries for field events—Northwestern, 33½; Central, 25; Western, 17; and Mackenzie, 5½.
