

Willis Ward Betters High Jump Record

Willis Ward of Northwestern, Detroit's leading interscholastic track star, bettered the existing high jump record by a half inch in a quadrangular meet yesterday. Northwestern, Mackenzie, Central and Western ran off the field-events yesterday in their meet, and today will compete in the track events. Northwestern has a lead of 33 points over the second team.

The city record for the high jump is 6 feet $\frac{1}{2}$ inch. Ward topped the bar at 6 feet 1 inch.

Pole vault—Won by Moore (Northwestern) and Maxam (Northwestern) both tied for first; third, Wagner (Western); fourth, Balog (Western), and Wilson (Central) (tied). Height—10 feet.

High jump—Won by Ward (Northwestern); second, Deneau (Mackenzie); third, Witowski (Western); fourth, Miller (Northwestern). Height—6 feet 1 inch (new city record).

Discus throw—Won by Fundis (Northwestern); second, Wickham (Northwestern); third, Carlson (Central), fourth, Buchanan (Central). Distance—118 feet 3 inches.

Shotput—Won by Fundis (Northwestern); second, Londke (Western); third, Savin (Central); fourth, Deneau (Mackenzie). Distance—41 feet 5 inches.

Broad jump—Won by Ward (Northwestern); second, Schwengert (Central); third, Hurd (Northwestern) and Deneau (Mackenzie) (tied). Distance—20 feet $4\frac{1}{4}$ inches.

Point summaries for field events—Northwestern, $33\frac{1}{2}$; Central, $8\frac{1}{2}$; Western, $7\frac{1}{2}$, and Mackenzie, $5\frac{1}{2}$.
