

**Lansing School Scores 52 Points to Beat Out Flint Central Team**

**HOFF SETS NEW RECORD**

**Captain Beats Mark of Bill Loving in 220-Yard Hurdles**

FLINT, May 19—A powerful and well balanced Lansing Eastern team showed clean heels to seven other Class A schools here Saturday, walking off with first honors in the regional scholastic track meet at Dort Memorial field. The winners scored 52 points to lead the second place Flint Central aggregation by 16 markers. Flint Northern placed third with 28½ points, Pontiac following with a count of 22.

Three field records fell before the onslaught of some 350 athletes, who participated in the meet. Although Frank Hoff, Lansing Eastern's star hurdler, failed to break the high hurdle record as was expected, he romped through to better a mark made by Loving, of Cass Tech, in the 220 yard low hurdles. Hoff's time was :25.5 or 7-10 of a second faster than the old mark.

CHICAGO, May 19 (AP)—Its string of victories still intact, Wisconsin Sunday night, anticipated clinching its first Big Ten baseball championship since 1912, by the end of the week.

Wisconsin stretched its string from five to seven straight last week, defeating Illinois and Chicago, each for the second time of the season. This week the Badgers have two engagements. Minnesota, already once defeated by the leaders, will be met at Minneapolis Tuesday, and Michigan, 1928 and 1929 titleholder, which has fallen into lean days, will be tackled at Madison Saturday. Victory in both games would make certain a major championship for Wisconsin.

The single game on Monday's program will occur at Columbus, O., where Ohio State and Michigan will meet for the second time of the campaign.
