

COLTS MADE BIG FAVORITES IN PREP MEET

Rivals Have Little Hope of
Beating Northwestern for
State Track Honors.

FIGHT FOR SECOND

Half Dozen Schools Will Be in
Scramble for Position
as Runners-up.

East Lansing, May 17.—Detroit Northwestern high school will rule easy favorites to capture the Class A championship when athletes gather here next Saturday to compete in the Michigan High School Athletic association track and field meet. Since this will be the last meet in which Detroit schools will compete with out-state athletes, the Colts will have the satisfaction of carrying home the final honors. The Detroit schools have decided to confine their activities to district competition in future years.

The way the wind is blowing in Michigan prep ranks this year was definitely pointed out a week ago at Ann Arbor when the Colts romped off with the university's invitational meet honors by scoring more than 50 points. There is no team in the field that can hope to even press Northwestern with its all-around speed and prowess. The only interest in competition will surround the drive for runner-up honors. Half a dozen schools will seek to climb into second place.

Other Classes Compete.

While the Class A schools are putting on their parade, the athletes from the other three divisions, B, C and D, will also be seeking respective championships. Upward of 500 high school athletes are expected to participate in the annual classic this year.

The prep school event will be the major attraction on the athletic calendar at Michigan State this week. There are three baseball games, two of which will be played at home. The Central Intercollegiate will draw the track team away from the campus for next week-end and the tennis men are due for their busiest week, being billed for four matches. The golfers will play Detroit City college at Detroit.
