

## COLTS FAVORED TO ADD STATE TITLE TO LIST

**Detroit School Will Have Full Entry in All Events at East Lansing.**

**ATTRACTS 2,000 BOYS**

**Time Schedule Is Announced for Two-Day Affair This Week.**

With a complete entry list in all events, Northwestern high school is favored to repeat its triumph in the mid-west and Detroit city meets by annexing the state track and field title Friday afternoon and Saturday, at East Lansing.

The Colts are certain of taking first place in three events at least, with their star, Willis Ward, entered in the low and high hurdles and the high jump. Ward is counted on to take the high jump despite the bad showing he made in this event last week in the city meet when he dropped out at five feet, seven inches.

**Have Strong Entry List.**

Detroit will have a strong representation at the two-day meet this week. Headed by Northwestern, some 10 or 12 metropolitan schools will send teams to East Lansing. Central, Cass Tech, Northeastern and Redford will all have a record entry.

This will be the last state track meet that Detroit schools will participate in as a recent ruling of the Detroit High School Athletic association bars competition in state tournaments after this year.

L. L. Frimodig, assistant athletic director at Michigan State, in charge of the meet, announced Tuesday that there would be no preliminaries in the Class A half-mile run on either day. This will be the first time in the history of the meet that preliminaries have not been held.

**Run Two Sections.**

The event will be run off in two sections with the full five points being awarded the winner in each section. The preliminaries have been eliminated because of the strain on the youthful athletes, Frimodig said.

It is expected that the two-day meet will attract some 2,000 athletes from all classes throughout the state.
