

DETROIT SCHOOL APPEARS LIKELY TRACK CHAMPION

Colts Off to Flying Start in Qualifying Tests—Flint Athletes Out.

East Lansing, May 24.—(By UP)—Running true to expected form Detroit Northwestern High school track and field stars today were in a position to easily repeat their performance of 1929 in walking off with Class "A" honors in the twenty-fourth annual Michigan Interscholastic Track and Field meet.

Rain, which approached the proportions of a cloudburst, ruined yesterday's program, putting on such a damper that four or five of the qualifying events must be staged this morning—weather permitting. Sprinters yesterday were forced to gallop around a track ankle deep with water and practically all of the field events were staged under the cover of the grand stands.

In the eight events completed in Class "A," Detroit Northwestern has qualified nine men, while Lansing Eastern, Cass Tech, of Detroit, and Grand Rapids South each have five men. Two colts qualified to represent their school in the finals of both the 120 low hurdles and the pole vault. One of the disappointments of the meet



was the failure of Flint Central and Northern, highly regarded entries, to place an athlete in the finals, thus far.

Ten events were completed in Class "B" and Monroe has nine men qualified, whereas, Niles, last year's title holders, have but four; South Haven, with five men remaining, apparently will offer Monroe its closest opposition, but both Cadillac and Three Rivers have three men still in the race.

Because of weather conditions, no attempt was made to clock new records.
