

COLTS PILE UP BIG POINT LEAD EARLY

Okemos Far in Front in Class D; Allegan Star Dominates B Division; Local Point Makers Are Few.

East Lansing, May 24.—Detroit Northwestern's crack track and field team took a big lead in the annual Michigan interscholastic track and field meet here Saturday morning, winning sufficient points in the early events to insure itself the 1930 championship.

With Ward, husky Detroit Negro, setting the pace in the hurdles, picking up a second in the high jump and with Fundis dominating the field events Northwestern was having a comparatively easy time of it.

McNutt Big Star.

Okemos was making a runaway race of class D, gathering points in every event programmed. In class B Allegan through the prowess of its individual star, McNutt, was out in the lead at the conclusion of the early events. Class C was a neck and neck race with a half dozen schools having a chance of copping. Laver of Lowell, star of the weight events, was making points for the Kent county school.

Grand Rapids schools were finding the going hard in all events. The big disappointment of the day was the failure of the local sprinters to gain a single point. The dash men from the Furniture city with the exception of Augst of Ottawa and Emery of Central failed to qualify. Included in this group of failures were Heintzelman of South and Zackewski of Union.

Point and Score Points.

Pantlind of Central picked up 2 points for his school by placing third in the high hurdles which Ward of Northwestern won. Ford of South got fourth in the discus. Cook felled the west side followers when he took only second in the shot put, a toss of 43 feet 3 inches winning the event. Already this season Cook has pushed the leaden ball more than 46 feet. Roger Brennan, champion of the 440-yard men around here, got fourth place in this class A competition.

Catholic's hopes were dashed when Scally, star sprinter, failed in both dash events. Lapinsky got third in the mile run after fighting a neck and neck battle with one other runner for three-quarters of the distance.

Samrick of East Grand Rapids made 5 points for the Waterman coached outfit by winning the 100-yard dash in handy fashion.

Walker Smith of Ottawa was third in the high jump, another event in which Detroiters dominated. Heamer of Godwin got third place in class C 100-yard dash while Lane of Grandville did likewise in the D mile.
