**Has a Runaway.**

Okemos had a runaway in class D, finishing with 34 points as compared to South Lake's 27 1-2. Middleton was third with 15 and other scorers were: Ebertha 10 1-2; Centerville, Comstock Park 8; Romulus 6; Petersburg 5 1-2; Parma 4; Grand Rapids Godwin, Alba 4; Charleville 3 1-3; Akron and Diamondale 3; Napoleon 2 1-4; Litchfield and Marne 1. The best performance of the day was the half mile that Tim Quinn, of Ludington, turned in the Class B event. He ran the distance in 1:58.8 to beat all the records in any state class. Other records to fall during the day were:

Class B—Howell's relay team set a mark of 1:32.9; Bernard McNutt, of Allegan, one of the individual stars of the day, set new records in both shot put, 46 ft. 8 1-2 inches and the discus 125 ft. 3 inches.

Class C—Coplin, Wayne, 880-yard run 2:04.4; Staugustine's of Kalamazoo in the relay 1:36.8; Laver Lowell, discus throw of 120 ft. 2 1-2 inches. Allen, Wayne, leap of 5 ft. 7 5-8 inches in the high jump.

Class D—Miles, of Okemos, 220-yard dash, :23.5; Chase, South Lake 120-yard hurdles, :15.2; Beaumont, Okemos, javelin throw, 170 ft. 5 inches; G. Vigland, Ebertha, pole vault, 10 ft. 11 5-8 inches; Chase, South Lake, high jump, 5 ft. 7 inches.
