

## ALGONAC FAVORED TO ANNEX COUNTY MEET AT TASHMOO

### St. Clair, St. Stephen Nines To Battle For Second Place; Big Entry List Announced

Algonac, May 30.—Algonac is favored to win the twelfth annual field and track meet in Tashmoor park, Friday, June 6.

Approximately 100 boys and girls will take part in the various events planned for the day.

In a practice meet Wednesday with Port Huron the down river athletes out-classed the Class A school in every event. Poole was first place in the high jump at 5 feet 7 inches, and is counted on for 5 points, as first place in the county meet.

Pearson, first place winner in the Class C pole vault in the state meet, last week, is expected to repeat at Tashmoor, for another first place. Drouillard for St. Clair should prove to be Pearson's strongest rival in this event.

Without Jack Moore in the St. Clair lineup, the Spurling coached team lacks a strong contender in the weight events. Moore last year established a record in the discus of 117 feet, which is likely to stand for some years to come.

Grice, Autterson, Novak and Chase are seasoned track men for St. Clair, while Scharnweber, King and Stommel are consistent field men.

Yale has a smaller line-up in track with Salerino, D. Brown, Zavits and Egan heading the track events and A. Tenniswood and Staley in the field events.

Merle J. Weaver, principal of St. Clair High school, and president of the association, today had not received entry lists from St. Stephen or Marine City.

Medals will be awarded to first, second and third place winners. Silver cups are awarded in the relay meets for the boys' and girls' relay champs.

A feature of the meet will be the play off between St. Clair and St. Stephen of Port Huron for second place in the county baseball race. Yale won the crown this year by taking all four scheduled games.

The first event, the 100 yard dash, will be called at 10 a.m. Fred H. Vincent, Port Huron Y. M. C. A., will be head official.

The events will be run off under rules of the Michigan High School Athletic association.

A contestant may compete in the 100 yard dash, 220 yard dash, and relay race, or in the 440 yard dash and relay. If he enters the half mile run he cannot enter any other track event. He cannot enter more than four events in field and track.

A school can enter four men in any one event.

First places will score 5, second 2, and third 1.
