

O'NEILL SETS DASH RECORD

**Titan Sprinter Wins 30-Yard
Event in Three and Two-
fifths Seconds.**

**Stanley Wright Takes '1,000'
in Annual State A. A. U.
Carnival.**

With Bill O'Neill, fleet football star, breaking the state record for the 30-yard dash and other Titans registering victories, University of Detroit athletes didn't delie the trust placed in them by Coach "Dad" Butler as they opened the winter campaign Saturday night in the state A. A. U. championship meet at Central high gym.

Willis Ward, Detroit Northwest-ern sprinter, forced O'Neill to exert himself in the dash event and the Detroit halfback snapped the tape in 32.5 seconds. He broke the mark of Claude Snary, of Ypsilanti, who hung up a record of 33.5 in 1926.

Stanley Wright, U. of D. middle distance man, chalked up the first Titan triumph of the evening in the 1,000 yard run with his team mate, Archie Yeager, tying for second place with Ray Swartz of Western State Teachers college. Wright took the lead when the pistol cracked and relinquished only once before a final sprint gave him a 10-yard victory as Swartz came up to deadlock with the tiring Yeager.

The 16-pound shotput found a strong array of behemoths tossing the iron ball. Kenneth Barnhill, of Western State, captured the event with a heave of 43 feet, 8 inches, which was four inches shy of the record for the event. Wallace Hoskins, Detroit policeman, was second and Henry Harper, of Western State, added more points to his team's total by annexing the third place. Fourth honors went to Joe Zear, University of Detroit football star.

Mike Magretta, an unattached entrant, was second with Otto Maynard of the Cadillac Athletic club, third, to score the first points of the evening for his organization. Nathaniel Logan, a Cass Tech high student hustled himself into the fourth position.
