Northwestern Athletes Tie Two Prep Records

Willis Ward and Lawrence Turner Equal City Marks in Hurdle Events as Colts Top Qualifiers in Track Meet.

Only two city track records were equaled as 200 prep school athletes competed in preliminaries of the twenty annual intercollegiate track meet at Central high school Wednesday afternoon, before a small crowd.

Willis Ward, the district track star of Northwestern's championship team, tied both low and high hurdle marks, while his teammate, Lawrence Turner, also equaled the record in clearing the high hurdle.

Ward ran the 25-yard low hurdle in four seconds flat to equal the city record held stoutly by Floyd Day, South River, both of North western, against the high hurdle, Lawrence Turner, of North western, equaled the record of Lawrence Turner, of North western, set in 1928 by Floyd Day, of Northwestern and was tied in 1922 by Fred O'Connell.

By their showing in the preliminaries the Colts became favorites to capture their eleventh track title this Saturday evening at Central high school.

The 100 and 200 yard team led the qualifiers with 45 men and a relay team, Northwestern is second in number of qualifiers having 45 men in all the events.

Northwestern athletes lifted in the best times recorded in the events and the relay besides giving high places in high jump, pole vault and shot put track, in which some flying marks were previously set.

Herbert Tod, of Northwestern, set the low time in the 200-yard dash, covering the distance in 55.45 seconds, which was 1.5 seconds better than turned in by Frank Shiner, of Northwestern, the second best performer.

Francis Shiner, of Northwestern, placed third in the 200-yard dash, coming within a half second of tying the record of 57.15 set

by Jack Dant, of Northwestern, in 1927.

William Laine, of Eastern, set an upset when he registered the best time, 2:11, in the 800 yards, of Northwestern, a 20-second better than the 2:31 which he set last year, but was in a slow heat and not exhibiting his true speed.

After all heats were run off to be given out, it was found that one boy was tied for first honors with 12.45. The field in this event was restricted down by some distance and the other will be run-off Saturday evening.

The Colts relay team, of Mark Duggan, Raymond Moore, Francis Shiner, and Herbert Tod, turned in the best time. The 100 and 200 yard team ran the mile in 27:45 seconds.
