

RECORDS ENDANGERED IN SATURDAY MEETS

Zackrzewski of Union Ties 100-Yard Dash Mark; Tipped Hurdle Keeps Pantlind from Clear Claim.

Predictions that the 1931 track season is due to bring further alterations in the all-time city records more than once came within ace of being fulfilled Saturday. At the Union-Muskegon meet one city mark was tied, while at the Central-Tech tests a record was broken but will not be claimed because of a technicality.

John Zackrzewski, captain of the Union High school team, now shares the city 100-yard dash mark after being clocked by several watches at 10.2 seconds Saturday at South field, where Union defeated Muskegon 64 3-5 to 48 2-5. The flying Zack is the fourth city high school athlete to make this time. Others sharing the record are Chapman of South (1926), Nelson of South (1928) and Scally of Catholic (1930).

Tips Last Hurdle.

At Central's meet with Tech at Houseman field Boyd Pantlind, Central's flashy high hurdler, was robbed of a clean-cut new city record in the 120-yard high event because his toe grazed the last hurdle and knocked it down. He ran the race in 15.8 seconds, by three watches, and was proclaimed a record breaker until the rule on record breaking in hurdle races was reviewed. A hurdler may knock down as many as two hurdles and still win his event but the national college rules provide that all hurdles must remain in place for a record performance. Pantlind's nearly faultless form almost assures him another record race, without displaced hurdles, before the season is over. The record now is 16.2 seconds.

Central defeated Technical, 76 to 42, Saturday, the Davis Tech men coming through strong in several events to make the meet interesting all of the way. Dykhouse of Tech beat out Central's touted dash experts, Drueke and Emery, in the hundred and pushed Emery to the limit in the 220. Tech had an advantage in the weight events and held its own in the running races, except for the hurdles. The high jump, pole vault and broad jump were clearly in Central's favor. Pantlind, besides winning the high hurdles, took the low hurdles and high jump and ran on the winning relay team.

Zack Near 220 Mark.

Capt. Zackrzewski of Union also came very near to a city mark in the 220-yard dash at South field Saturday, doing 22.9, only a tenth of a second slower than Lester Nelson's record time. VanderLinde, the Union broad jumper who made a new city mark of 21 feet, 7 1/4 inches a week earlier, was content with a mere 20 feet, 2 inches Saturday to win his event. He was bested considerably by winners in two other meets Saturday. Ed Kalawart doing 20 feet, 10 3/4 inch at Ottawa Hills in the morning and Emery at Central winning with 21 feet 1 1/2

inches at Houseman in the afternoon.

A new Union record in the 440 by Burt and exceptional low hurdles and discus marks by Muskegonites were other features of the Union-Muskegon meet. Sprau won the discus event with a toss of 115 feet, while Lewis did the low hurdles in 27.4 seconds. Polmanteer of Union did not run in the mile, having suffered an attack of appendicitis last week.
