

FOUR RECORDS BROKEN IN STATE TRACK MEET

EAST LANSING, May 23.—(By AP)—With preliminaries and four finals run off yesterday, championships were being decided today in the annual state high school track and field meet.

Four new records were established in yesterday's preliminaries, while two contestants tied a Class B record in one of the finals.

Lloyd Pantlind, Grand Rapids Central, raced to a new record of 13.8 in the 120-yard high hurdles and led the field in the 220-yard low hurdles, but not in record time.

Two Class C records fell when Hinckman, of Northville, heaved the shot 43 feet, 1 inch, and McCorry, of Ontonagon, sailed the discus 121 feet, 7 inches. A special Class D event record joined the

list of casualties when Chase, of South Lake, raced over the 120-yard low hurdles in 14.5.

Powers, of Mt. Pleasant, and Williams, of Hastings, leaped 5 feet, 9 inches, to tie the Class B high jump mark in one of the finals.

In number of qualifiers, Monroe high school, with eight, was a favorite to repeat in Class A its triumphs of last year in Class B. Grand Rapids Central and Grand Rapids Union qualified five men each.

Grand Haven and South Haven apparently will fight it out for Class B honors with eight qualifiers apiece. In Class C, it was a toss-up, with a scattered field, while South Lake was the favorite in Class D with six qualifiers.
