EARLY EVENTS GIVE REDS SLIGHT LEAD

Pantlind First in High Hurdles and Emery Wins Quarter; VanHouten Places; Union and South Far Behind.

East Lansing, May 23.—Muskegon High and Grand Rapids Central were engaged in a bitter track and field duel early Saturday afternoon with the state interscholastic track and field championship at stake.

With nine events run off Muskegon was leading with 18 points and Central was only two points behind. Ann Arbor and the premeet favorite, Monroe were deadlocked for third place with 12 points each and Kalamazoo Central was fourth with 11½ points.

Central's points were scored by Boyd Pantlind, hurdler extraordinary who copped the 120-yard high hurdles and placed second in the 220-yard low sticks and Emery, who copped first place in the first of the two 440-yard dashes. Van Houten, picked up two extra points for Central in the hurdles.

Catholic Disappoints.

Unlon's star sprinter, John Zackrzewski, proved a big disappointment to followers of the west side school, winding up in fourth place in the 100-yard event. His team mate Symko, beat him in the final.

In class B Catholic was disappointing its supporters by rather mediocre work in the early events. Scally, star sprinter fizzled badly and got no better than fourth in the century while Fennell, star miler, wound up crossing the finish line in fifth position. Dennis of Ludington cracked the record for the mile Saturday morning for class B schools negotiating the distance in 4:26.5. This mark bests the old record held by Potter of Coldwater since 1924.

Comstock Wins Points.

Comstock park grabbed a first place in class D when Wolcott, star quarter-miler, won the event easily in 56.1. Wolcott won this same race last year.

Unlon's chances for scoring more points were minimized when Palmiteer, star miler, was forced to quit running after the second lap in the mile.

Shortly after lunch South has 7 points, Ottawa Hill 4½, Unlon 3 and Creston 2.

Floyd Pantlind's performance in establishing a new state high hurdle mark of 15.8 in the opening event of the preliminaries Friday sent the meet away to a fast start. Pantlind's performance in the highs broke a mark that had stood since 1924, when Spence of Detroit Western made a record of 16 seconds.

Kuzoo Boy Gets Mark.

Haverman of Kalamazoo Central also set a record in the javelin toss Friday, with 176 feet, 11 inches. More surprising however, to the Grand Rapids contingent was the qualifying of Joslin of South with a throw of 144 feet, 3 inches. Joslin had not practiced the event at all this year, as the javelin is barred from Grand Rapids athletic fields by order of the board of education. Scally of Catholic Central had second place among class B javelin qualifiers with 148 feet, 6 inches, but Catholic is not subject to the general ban in Grand Rapids and Scally has thrown the lance, though only a little.

Both B and C discus throwers beat the class A marks, McCorry of Ontonogan getting out to 121 feet in class C, incidentally besting the present state class C record holder, Elmer Layer of Lowell, who qualified with 116 feet, 9 inches.

Hobart Comes Through.

Central qualified Pantlind and VanHouten in both hurdles, but failed entirely in the high jump, where Hobart of Ottawa came through to win a third of a point in a tie for fifth, this being one of the few events completed Friday.

Creston qualified only two men Friday, Dedinas ranking third in the shot and Bresnahan making the finals in the 220.
