

MONROE SCORES GREAT VICTORY IN STATE MEET

Class A Track Title Goes to Former B Winners: Flint Schools Trail.

East Lansing, Mich., May 23.—(By AP)—Monroe high school's great all-around track team today spurred to victory in the twenty-fifth annual championship meet for Class A high schools of lower Michigan.

Trophies of victory in a spectacular meet, were shared by South Haven, winner of the Class B title; Algonac, Class C champions, and Centerville, best in Class D competition.

Monroe was pressed by Grand Rapids Central and Muskegon. The pole vault gave Monroe a total of 28 points, while Grand Rapids Central finished second with 26. Muskegon was just behind with 24.

Other teams in Class A finished in the following order: Kalamazoo Central, 29 1-3; Grand Rapids Union, 20; Ann Arbor, 14; Grand Rapids South, 12 1-2; Lansing Eastern, 12; Grose Pointe, 9; Grand Rapids Ottawa Hills, 8 1-3; Pontiac, 8; Benton Harbor, 6; Jackson, 5 1-2; Ferndale, Flint Central and Northern, Muskegon Heights, and Saginaw Arthur All, four each; Grand Rapids Creston, Mt. Clemens, and Saginaw Eastern, three each; Lansing Central, 2, and Fordson, 1-3.

Eight new records were established in four classes. President of Grand Rapids Central, stepped over the 120-yard high hurdles in 15.8 for a new mark and Havenman, Kalamazoo, heaved the javelin 176 feet 11 inches for another Class A record.

Donalds, Ludington, did the mile in 1:36.5 for a new Class C record. Erickson, St. Joseph, pole vaulted 11 feet, 5 1-2 inches to better the old mark of Carl Nordberg, of the same school, by half an inch.

McCarry, one-man track team from Ontonagon, pushed the shot 45 feet, 7 inches and discs 121 feet, 7 inches for a new record in Class C. McBurnum, Caro, leaped 5 feet 11 1-4 inches in a new high jumping record. Chase, South Lake's star athlete, set a new Class D record for the 120-yard low hurdles time of 17.8.
