

Eastern Leads Prep Rivals In Relay Tests

Indians Place Teams in all Nine Events of Spring Carnival; Northwestern's 880 Yards Quartet Is Disqualified for Using Eldred, Ineligible Man.

EASTERN HIGH SCHOOL'S track team, which placed only one man in the city team track meet last Saturday, showed to best advantage Wednesday afternoon in the qualifying trials for the city relay carnival. The Indian runners qualified in every event at Central athletic field, while their field event men were performing a similar feat in the preliminary tests at Codd field. Finals will be held Friday afternoon at Central.

The meet is open only to athletes who did not place in the team track championships and with only Alston, who had placed in the 100, missing the Indian team was virtually intact.

Northwestern high school, winner of the city team track meet, was able to place only three teams. The Colts' 880-yard relay team registered the fastest time, but was disqualified because of the use of Lawrence Eldred, an ineligible man. Eldred ran last week on the relay team which qualified Northwestern for the city finals and, although he did not run in the championship race, was held to be a member of the team.

High Jumpers in Form.

Scoring was based on the efforts of four-man teams from each school in every event and Eastern was first in only one, but was second best in three others, third in two, fourth in one and fifth in two.

Eastern's best showing was in the high jump, in which Aubrey Pearson and Walter Bierkamp cleared 5 feet 8 inches, Julius Redmond leaped 5 feet 9 inches and James Martin jumped 5 feet 10 inches.

William Kachler, of Eastern, registered the best throw in the discus, 107 feet 1 inch, good enough to take second place in the city meet. The Indians placed third among discus qualifiers however, because of the 60-foot toss by a weaker member of the team.

Hantramck was second in number of qualifiers, placing four relay teams and four teams in the field events. The Cosmos were best in the shot put, in which they had a

combined total of 152 feet 11 1/4 inches. Ed Page, star weight man, led the Cosmos with a throw of 40 feet 7 1/2 inches. Alfonso McKibbin, of Eastern, had the best heave of 42 feet 2 1/2 inches.

Central Leads in Two-Mile.

Central placed third with five teams, all of which finished fairly high. The Trailblazer quartet of Fred Poss, Martin Paul, John Myatt and Albert Shulman led two-mile qualifiers with a time of 8:39.3-5. In the broad jump the four Central leapers had a high total of 72 feet 10 inches. The best

Prep Ban Placed On Chuck Kocsis

Because of his participation in a team match between Redford and Glen Oaks Golf clubs last Sunday, Charles Kocsis, state amateur golf champion, is no longer eligible to represent Redford high school in interscholastic athletics, according to Vaughan S. Blanchard, director of athletics in Detroit schools. Kocsis violated a ruling forbidding competition in organized leagues outside prep ranks during the season.

Kocsis' loss will be a severe blow to Redford. The team is at present tied with Highland Park for the West Side dual match championship. The husky star, who graduates in June, recently led his team to the city medal play title, winning the individual championship himself.

effort was that of Linson, of Hamtramck, who did 19 feet 7½ inches. Valentine, of Eastern, did 19 feet 7 inches.

Southeastern placed relay teams in four of the five relay events, registering the best times in the 440 and mile, third in four-mile and fourth in two-mile. The Junglers failed to place in the field events.

University of Detroit and Western high schools qualified four teams each. The Cubs placed third in the 440, third in the shot and fourth in the high jump and discus. The Cowboys were second in the high jump, third in the 880 relay, fifth in the shot put and sixth in the discus.

Polar Bears Top Discus Field.

Three other schools besides Northwestern placed three teams. Of those Highland Park looked best with the lowest time in 880 relay and the best combined total in the discus. The Polar Bears also placed sixth in the 440. Northeastern and Redford each placed two relay teams and one team in the field events.

Four Cass milers, Robert Quaid, Homer Middlewood, Early Williams and James Searcy, covered the 16 laps in the four-mile relay in 20 minutes, 10 4-5 seconds, to lead qualifiers in that event. Tech also had a sixth in the two-mile. Cooley, Northern, Pershing teams placed in two events but failed to gain a first between them.

Denby and Mackenzie placed only in the 880 relay, Mackenzie finishing fifth and Denby sixth. Southwestern was the only one of the 17 schools entered which failed to qualify a team.
