**Cadillac A. C. Holds Open Meet at Fair Grounds**

Some of Michigan's foremost athletes are included in the large field that will vie for honors in the Cadillac Athletic club's open invitational track meet at the State Fair grounds Saturday afternoon.

Lee Bartlett, javelin thrower, who placed in the national intercollegiate while competing for Albion college; Rha Arnold and Merrill Hershey, Ypsi runners; Chester Krajewski, distance man, and Potter, U. of M. pole vaulter and javelin thrower, are among the stars whose points will count for the Cadillac club.

Negro stars competing for the D. A. A. are conceded a good chance to take team honors. John Lewis, former national indoor 400-yard champion; Lovve Snowden, speedy dash man; Eugene Beatty, sprint and hurdle star, and Willis Ward, former Northwestern high student, who holds the world interscholastic high jump record of six feet six inches, are certain point winners.
