

### DALY OF CASS BREAKS MARK FOR MILE RUN

#### Schoolboy Star Cuts 51.5 Seconds from City Record

William Daly, Cass Tech athlete, yesterday shattered the City High School mile record of 5:01.34 seconds at Roosevelt Field in the first preliminary to the City Championship outdoor meet.

Heartman led in the number of athletes qualifying with nine. Northwestern, outdoor champions, placed first, placed eight, indoor champions, qualified seven boys. Others were Central, six; Northeastern, three; Redford, Highland Park, Perching, Southwestern, and Cass Tech, two each, and Mackenzie and Dooby. Other preliminaries will be held Thursday at the same field. Finals will be next Wednesday.

Daly was matched in a qualifying heat with Stanley Rosenwald, of Heartman, and Leonard Merrill, of Northwestern. The Cass star took the lead at the start and the quarter was 25 yards out in front.

At the half mile it became apparent that he would shatter the mark established by Pogromer, of Eastern, in 1926. If he could maintain the pace he might finish in the time coach Daly stretched out at a killing pace in the last two laps. He misjudged his stride and breathed the large webby and without the spectacular dash that he characterized his distance in the past. But his spirit during the 1/2 mile lap carried him to the tape faster than any other prep athlete in the history of City League athletics.

**May Meet Record Again**

Don Cooper, Cass coach, prophesied the boy would better his own mark next Wednesday.

Heartman placed two athletes in the mile finals. The Southwink brothers, Stanley and John, were clocked at 4:55 and 4:52, respectively.

Phillip Kelley, of Southwestern, placed in second, best time of 4:50. Heartman's son, Hutchinson, was timed at 4:50.

William East, of Heartman, came within one-fifth of a second of equalling his own record in the 100-yard dash when he won his heat in 1:12. That the semi-finals will be interesting is indicated by the time gained in by the other participating athletes. Arthur Wright and Mitch, of Northwestern; Widman, of Central; and Scott, of Heartman, all were clocked one-fifth of a second behind Bill Bryant.

Constantine Eizek, of Perching, registered an upset in the shot put when he led the qualifiers with a throw of 42 feet 6 1/2 inches. Both track, of Highland Park, was next with 42 feet 8 1/2 inches. Earl Meyers, the Indian star, failed to live up to expectations. His best effort was 41 feet 6 1/2 inches.

**Hawthorne Takes It Easy**

Joe Gordon, of Heartman, led in the broad jump trials with a mark of 21 feet 7 1/2 inches. He was a foot ahead of Demons, of Mackenzie. Tucker, of Perching, Hawthorne, of Northwestern, and Ted Bryant, of Northwestern, were next.

Ray Hill (DNY) again made terms in the best time in the 40-yard trials. He finished easily in front of his opponents in his heat and was timed at 5:24. Seven others were qualified.

Gene Stewart, Northeastern indoor high hurdles champion, won his heat in the 120-yard event in 1:12. Demons, of Southwestern, and Anderson, of Eastern, also won heats at 1:11. Ten other athletes qualified for the semi-finals.

Bill Hawthorne, Eastern star pommel, did not attempt to shatter his record. The Eastern athlete made the indoor mark of 11 feet 1 inch and has leaped 12 feet in practice this spring. He qualified for the final with Thompson, of Northeastern; Cooper, of Central; Summons, of Highland Park, and Lockett, of Heartman.
