

KALAMAZOO CENTRAL LEADS TRACK MEET

Cadillac Jumps Ahead in Class B as Finals Open in High School Event

Kalamazoo Central took the lead in the Class A and Cadillac jump ahead in Class B competition as finals opened just before noon Saturday at the state high school track meet at East Lansing. Handicapped by raw weather and a stiff breeze, athletes were able to establish only one new record, a new high jump mark in Class B by Warmbein of St. Joseph.

Fewell of Kalamazoo won the high jump with a leap of 5 feet 8 3/4 inches, while his team mate, O'Connor, was tied in second place with Kelly of Pontiac, giving Kalamazoo 8 1/2 points in the event. Pontiac made 4 1/4 points in this event and 4 in the subplot for 8 1/4 points, just behind the leaders.

Darling of Ann Arbor won the shot with a throw of 47 feet 2 1/2 inches. Cadillac won 10 of the possible 15 points in the Class B shot put. Garn won the event with throw of 44 feet. Anderson, Cadillac, was second, and Wiseman, his teammate, placed fourth. Grand Rapids, Ottawa Hills, was leading Class A in entries surviving the hurdle and 100-yard dash preliminaries. It qualified three men for finals in the two hurdles. Ann Arbor, Lansing Central, Muskegon, and Saginaw qualified two each.

Traverse City was ahead in the number of Class B qualifiers with five. Dowagiac had four while Alma, Dearborn, and River Rouge qualified three each. Boyne City, Rockford, and Algonac qualified three each to head the Class C division. Saranac and Centerville led the Class D group four qualifiers each.

Class A: finals—Shot put first, Darling (Ann Arbor), second, Allen (Pontiac); third, Kelly, Monroe; fourth, Oatley, (Grand Rapids, Creston); fifth, Johnson (Flint Central) distance 47 feet 2 inches. Final.

Class B: Finals—Shot put—First, Garn (Cadillac); second, Anderson (Cadillac); third, Allen (Charlotte); fourth, Woelke, (Dearborn); fifth, Wiseman (Cadillac). Distance—44 feet. Final.

Class C: finals—Broad jump, first, McDurmon (Caro); second, Sweet, (Fremont); third, White (Boyer City); fourth, Summons, (Cass City); fifth, K. Edwards (Williamston). Distance—20 feet 9 3/4 inches. Final.

Class B: finals—High jump, first, Warmbein (St. Joseph); second, Easley (Dowagiac). Tied for third, Steinbacher (South Haven) and Woelke (Dearborn), tie for fifth, Nelson and Kraft (Niles). Height 5 feet 10 3/4 inches. (New record) old record 5 feet 9 inches made by Pritchard (Allegan), 1921, Powers, (Mt. Pleasant) and Williams, (Hastings), 1931, final.
