

GRAND RAPIDS TEAM WINNER

Ottawa Hills Captures Prep Track Title

EAST LANSING, May 28—(A.P.)—Grand Rapids Ottawa Hills High School won the Class A championship at the annual State interscholastic track meet, ending out Ann Arbor, 28 to 24. The relay, which went to the Grand Rapids team, decided the meet, Ann Arbor taking fifth.

Only one new record was established in the Class A competition. Stan of Monroe vaulted 12 feet 5 inch for a new pole vault mark. The old mark was 11 feet 10 1/2 inches made by Wilson, of Muskegon, in 1929.

St. Joseph was crowned king of the Class B high schools, scoring 23 points. Downman, its closest rival, trailed with 14 points.

Two New Records

Only two new records were established in the B competition. Warner Peabain, St. Joseph's star athlete, leaped over the high jump bar at a new height of 5 feet 10 1/2 inches, surpassing the old mark of 5 feet 9 inches. Erickson, St. Joseph, vaulted 11 feet 8 inches to best his own record of last year by one-half inch.

Caro Wins in Class C

Caro won the Class C championship, scoring 23 points to 14 for Bufile City in second place. Caro McDermott, of Caro, was a track to team himself, taking first place in the high and low hurdles, high jump and broad jump.

Class C athletes established new records in the high hurdles, mile run and half-mile relay. McDermott won on the high hurdles in 1:18 and Heacock, of Almont, ran the mile in 4:42 1/2. The Western State High relay team finished in the record time of 1:18 1/2.

Centerville High Wins

Centerville High successfully defended its Class D championship. It scored 24 points to 19 1/2 for South Lake and 16 for Michigan, its closest rival.

New records were made in four events. Brown, of Centerville, ran the high hurdles in the new time of 1:18. Henry, of Madgown City, set the pole vault at 12 feet 3 1/2 inches in the new time of 1:18. The Eastern of Alabaster, vaulted to a new height of 11 feet. The South Lake half-mile relay team ran the distance in 1:38 1/2 for a new record.
