

OTTAWA HILLS WINS STATE TRACK CROWN

Small Team of Six Athletes Takes Five Firsts to Nose Out Ann Arbor for Class A Honors 26 to 24.

Six Ottawa Hills High school boys made a trip to East Lansing Saturday and didn't go just for the ride. The compact little group had power enough to win the state interscholastic track championship for class A schools and demonstrate that ability means more than numbers.

Ottawa Hills' relay team, the combination that pulled the regional meet out of the fire by a quarter of a point a week earlier, repeated its decisive performance to win the state title for Ottawa in the final event. The Indians were two-points behind Ann Arbor in the totals when the relay was called, but smashed through to win the event and five additional points, while Ann Arbor could do no better than fifth in the race. Ottawa ended the day with 26 points to 24 for Ann Arbor. No other school was within 10 points of the two leaders.

Ann Arbor Had Eight Men.

In this meet, more than any other on the state's spring program, individual ability counts heavily. Ottawa Hills with six athletes, two of whom competed only in the relay, won the title, and Ann Arbor, with only eight men, was runner-up. A contrast, for example, was Muskegon with 21 qualified entries and a final point total of 6 for fourteenth place.

Although Stiles and Jefferson of Ottawa competed only in the relay, their efforts were as important as any. Ottawa turned in a relay time of 1:33.1 much faster than Central's city record here of 1:34.4. Particular credit goes to Stiles, who ran the third leg, and handed Ed Kalawart a lead on the final leg that was enough and more than enough.

Kalawart Ties for Honors.

While other Grand Rapids schools made creditable showings at the meet, their achievements were dimmed by those of the Indians. Ottawa took five firsts on a program of 13 events against 28 other class A schools, and added an extra point through a fifth in the high hurdles. Ed. Kalawart, star of the Indians teams in football and track for three seasons, capped his high school achievements fittingly by tying with Tantsi, Ann Arbor colored star, for high individual point winning honors. Each had 11½ points to his credit. Kalawart won the high hurdles and broad jump and shared the relay points, while Tantsi had a first and two third places individually, as well as a quarter of a point through his team's fifth place in the relay.

Howard Davidson, winning the half-mile with a sprint finish that brought him from fourth place to first in the last 1000 yards, gave Ottawa the five points that placed it in position to win through taking the relay. Harvey Woodstra contributed six points through winning the low hurdles and placing fifth in the highs. The only disappointment for Ottawa was Schroeder's failure to place in the broad jump, but in the final analysis the lost points were not needed.

Catholic and South Tie.

Grand Rapids Catholic and South, tied for sixth place with 11 points each, had good performances. South could have been close on the heels of the leaders if its field event entries had matched earlier achievements of this season. Bochus, who has vaulted higher than the new state class A record of 12 feet ¾ inch by Stein of Monroe, dealt South a blow when he took his three trials and failed at 10 feet, 6 inches. Archie Ross, South's regional shot-put winner also was off form and failed to place in that event. Creston men in these events did better than those of South, Oatley making a fourth in the shot while Powers got a fraction of a point through a tie for fifth in the vault. Creston had a total of 7 1-6 points.

Catholic's respectable total came through capable sprinting of Voorheis, who distanced Bresnahan of Creston and Dykehouse of Tech in both dashes. He had placed third to these two in both of the regional sprints, but turned the table at the state meet to take second in the 220 and third in the 100, the leading Grand Rapids man in both races. Rysko, Catholic's quarter miler, ran second in the fastest division

of the two-section 440 event to add 4 points to the Catholic total.

Floyd Thomas, in placing second in the mile against one of the fastest fields ever to compete in a state class A race over that distance, helped to brighten the day for South. Darwin Jones, who won one of the two quarter-mile races, added 5 points. South's other place winner was Lauterhahn, who placed fourth in the quarter-mile race in which Rysko had been second.

Central with 5½ points, Union with 4 and Davis Tech with 3½ rounded out the tallying for Grand Rapids schools. Central made most of its points through a second in the relay, after its high jumpers had disappointed in the morning events. VanderLinde of Union stood second to Kalawart in the high jump. Tech's points came through the achievements of Dykehouse in the dashes.

East Grand Rapids made 5½ points in the class C meet, Bobczynski taking 4 of them through a second place in the high hurdles. McCarthy won a fraction of a point in the vault, while East was fifth in the relay race. Grand Rapids St. Francis took 1½ points in class B. Bogaski won fifth in the 220.
