While other Grand Rapids schools made creditable showings at the meet, their achievements were dimmed by those of the Indians. Ottawa took five firsts on a program of 13 events against 28 other class A schools, and added an extra point through a fifth in the high hurdles. Ed. Kalawart, star of the Indians teams in football and track for three seasons, capped his high school achievements fittingly by tieing with Tantsi, Ann Arbor colored star, for high individual point winning honors. Each had 11½ points to his credit. Kalawart won the high hurdles and broad Jump and shared the relay points, while Tantsi had a first and two third places individually, as well as a quarter of a point through his team's fifth place in the relay. Howard Davidson, winning the half-mile with a sprint finish that brought him from fourth place to first in the last 1000 yards, gave Ottawa the five points that placed it in position to win through taking the relay. Harvey Woodstra contributed six points through winning the low hurdles and placing fifth in the highs.
