

Ward Defeated in Sprint But Sets High Jump Mark

Michigan Swamps Field in State A. A. U. Indoor Meet; Ypsi Normal Second

ANN ARBOR, Feb. 23.—(A. P.)—The University of Michigan track team swamped the field in the State A. A. U. indoor championships at Yost Field House tonight. The University athletes piled up 55 points, while Michigan Normal was in second place with 38½ points. Detroit City Colleges had six points and the remaining 4½ points were scattered among other contestants.

Races were run at metric distances for the first time, and all of tonight's running performances will establish State indoor A. A. U. records. Compared with similar distances in the English system of measuring, times for the middle distance events were fast.

Chill Allen of Michigan ran 600 meters, which is nearly 660 yards, in one minute is nearly 660 yards. Howell, of the University track team, turned in a 4:04.8 for the 1,500-meter run, and Ned Turner's time for 1,000 meters (about 1,100 yards) was 2 minutes 32.9 seconds.

Willis Ward, Michigan all-around star, was defeated by Fred Schatte of Normal in the finals of the 60-meter dash in 6.9 seconds, but cleared 6 feet 4½ inches in the high jump for a new State A. A. U. record.

Ward and Bill Zepp, of Michigan Normal, were tied for individual honors with eight points each. Zepp placed first in the 5,000-meter run and second in the 1,500-meter.

The University team took six first places, five seconds, three thirds and three fourths.

Charles Fosger, of Detroit Y. M. C. A., Michigan A. A. U. walking champion, won the 1,500-meters walk.

Hawley Egleston and Boyd Pantlind, University of Michigan hurdlers, ran almost a dead heat in the 60-meter hurdles finals, with Pantlind taking the decision less than a step ahead. Beatty, of Normal, was third and Simmons, also of Normal, fourth. The time was 8.5 seconds.

Le Roy Dues, of Detroit City College, won the 16-pound shot put with a toss of 48 feet 11 inches (14.91 meters).

University runners took three of

the first four places in the 1,500 meters run. Doc Howell finished first, Bill Zepp, of Michigan Normal was second, Jack Childs of Michigan was third, and Bill Hill, of Michigan was fourth. The time was 4 minutes 4.8 seconds.

Chuck Debaker, of Michigan, was second in the 600-meter run. H. Ryan, unattached was third and Caplis of Michigan Normal was fourth. The race was run in the fast time of one minute 24.9 seconds.

Kahler, of Michigan Normal, gave Turner a great battle and finished second in the 1,000-meter. Harvey Smith, Michigan freshman, was third.

Clark Haskins, of the Detroit Police Department, retained his title in the thirty-five-pound weight
