

## Cosmos Retain Lead by Placing Seven More in Prep Meet Finals

Hamtramck's track team took another stride toward the City prep title Thursday by qualifying seven more athletes for the finals in trials at the Central gym.

The Cosmos now have a total of 17 athletes in the semi-finals and finals of the City meet to be held in the same gym Saturday night at 8 o'clock. Cooley, a favorite contender, placed five boys in the trials and in addition qualified a relay team.

Eastern High showed strength in the shot put by qualifying two boys in the event. With heaves of 41 feet seven inches, Jess Corona and Harry Benevenuti led all other weightmen. Luther Fredricks, Indian half-miler, also qualified, as did Julius Redmond in the high jump. Eastern, defending champion, has seven athletes entered in the finals.

Northwestern, an early season favorite to win the City crown, fell
