**Thinclid Carnival at College
Saturday to Attract Bevy
Of 138 Teams**

FULLER BRIGHTEST HOPE

Several Lansing prep thinclids appear to have an excellent chance to finish in the money in the annual Michigan intercollegiate track and field meet to be held at Michigan State college Saturday.

One hundred and thirty-eight teams in four classes from all over the lower peninsula will compete in the state meet. Class C leads with 49 schools represented and 34 Class D teams will compete. There will be 29 Class A and 56 Class B schools represented.

Lansing will have 21 men competing at the stadium Saturday. Fifteen will represent Eastern in nine events, while Central will send six men to take part in seven events.

May Get Four Firsts

Judging from records in regional meets last Saturday, four first places may fall to Lansing entries. Fuller of Eastern had the best time in the 440 yard dash in 31.9. The next best time was 33.0 by Laurierbach of Grand Rapids South. Spencer, another Eastern Quaker, covered the 800 in 2:08.9 to lead in this event. Werner of Grand Rapids Central, the Ypsilanti regional, was his nearest rival. The Eastern half mile relay team chalked up 1:34.0 to lead in this event, with Kalamazoo registering 1:34.1 and Grand Rapids, 1:34.6.

Ronald Carllock, Central's dash star, appears headed for difficulty in the century. His time was 1:12.1 in the regional, while Kolbe, Saginaw ace, was clocked in 1:07.3 and has run faster than that. This season, Carllock's chances appear a little brighter in the 220. His regional mark was 27.3. Broekema of Kalamazoo equaled this and Brounman of Grand Rapids Central and Murray of Mt. Clemens each came in in 27.5.

Fast Mile Promised

Braund of Grand Rapids ran the mile in 4:34.1, and Gunn of Central had the next best time of 4:46.0. Hicks of Central and Spauld of Eastern are considered only an outside chance in the pole vault, but Farrell of Grand Rapids Central cleared 12 feet, 1 inch, and two other regional winners made 11 feet. Walk-Bowers of Eastern will have to extend or himself to place in the shot put. The best heave in the regional was 47 feet and 7 1/2 inches by Warner of Grand Rapids and South, and there were three other winning puts better than Swartz's 40 feet 4 1/2 inches.

The best regional record in the best broad jump was 21 feet 3/4 of an inch by Piets of Saginaw. Armstrong of Eastern won with 20 feet 8 inches, and there were two other regional record jumpers ahead of him. The best height in the high jump was 5 feet 9 1/2 inches made by Powell and McClain of Kalamazoo. Broekema of Eastern and Christians of Ann Arbor led as 5 feet 8 inches in the five-A league meet.

Lansing entries in the state meet will be as follows:

Eastern—Armstrong, 100, 220, broad jump; Fuller, 440; Spencer and Adams, 800; Spornick and Maden, pole vault; Swartz, shot put; Turk, broad jump; Broekema, high jump; Reelock, Armstrong, Turk, Fuller, relay.

Central—Carllock, 100, 220; Harryman, 120-yard high hurdle; Gunn, mile; Barnett, 440; Hicks, pole vault; Osline, shot put.
